

# Maine International Film Festival:

ooking for entertainment and enrichment in July? Look no further than the 27th annual Maine International Film Festival! Organized by the Maine Film Center, MIFF will present over 100 films (features + shorts) over ten days, July 12–21. You'll be able to see a wide range of new independent films from Maine and beyond, both fiction and nonfiction. The festival will also present achievement awards to two internationally renowned movie directors.

This year will be MIFF's sophomore season in the Maine Film Center's new home on the second floor of the Paul J. Schupf Art Center at 93 Main Street in Waterville. All festival screenings will take place in the Maine Film Center's three screening rooms and in the Waterville Opera House, which is linked to the Schupf Center by an enclosed skywalk.


In this article, we'll discuss the highlights for the first Waterville Rocks concert of 2024. festival's first seven days. (We'll talk about its closing weekend next week.) These highlights include premiere screenings of four Maine-themed feature films and presentations of Lifetime and Midlife Achievement Awards to directors Jos Stelling and Mary Harron, respectively. Except where otherwise noted, the screenings described below take place in the Waterville Opera House and start at 7:00 p.m.

The festival opens at 6:30 on Friday, July 12, at the Waterville Opera House with the Maine premiere of Every Little Thing, a lyrical documentary about a woman living in the hills above Los Angeles whose calling is to rescue injured and abandoned hummingbirds. Following the screening, you can stroll down to Head of Falls to hear Portland septet Rustic Overtones perform at the

The next night, at 7:00, you'll be able to watch the world premiere of the first of four Maine feature films. Lost on a Mountain in Maine is a dramatization of the endearing and enduring true tale of 12-yearold Donn Fendler, who was lost for nine days in the wilderness of Mt. Katahdin, Maine's highest peak, in 1939. (Unlike most festival feature films, Lost on a Mountain in Maine will be shown only once, so be sure not to miss it!)

Although Fendler's story of survival is much known and much loved in Maine, Lost on a Mountain in Maine is the only one of the four Maine movies not to be filmed in the Pine Tree State. Still, besides the story itself, the film has other strong Maine connections: Waterville native Ryan Cook and fellow Central Mainer Derek Desmond are pro-

ducers on the film — they also co-directed a documentary, *Finding Donn Fendler: Lost on a Mountain in Maine 72 Years Later*, which screened to acclaim at MIFF in 2011 — and Camden native Caitlin FitzGerald (*The Trial of the Chicago 7, It's Complicated*, and *Masters of Sex*) stars as Donn Fendler's mother.

On Sunday, you can see the U.S. premiere of the festival's first made-in-Maine feature, *Carlo...and His Merry Band of Artists*. This documentary explores the life and legacy of Bowdoinham artist and art activist Carlo Pittore (1943-2005). His story is revealed through casual conversation around a picnic table by some of his closest friends and artistic colleagues, including Central Mainers Natasha Mayers, Herb Hartman, Abby Shahn, Pam Smith, and Kathy Bradford.

On Monday, MIFF takes a break from screening Maine features to present its Lifetime Achievement Award to Dutch director Jos Stelling, who will turn 79 during this year's festival. This will actually be Stelling's second Lifetime award; his first was in 1999. According to MIFF Programming Director Ken Eisen, Stelling's "absolutely unique directorial style has graced theaters and festivals from Cannes to Venice with a pioneering blend of humor, imagery, and surrealism."




Although many of Stelling's distinctive films were shown at the former Railroad Square Cinema, MIFF's former home, only one Stelling film will be shown at this year's festival, *Natasja's Dance*. In this North American premiere of what Stelling claims will be his final opus, a former ballerina persuades a lonely man to travel with her to her native Russia.

A day later, Canadian director Mary Harron, who is just seven and a half years younger than Stelling, will receive MIFF's Midlife Achievement Award. According to a MIFF press release, Harron's "storied career in film and television has yielded a catalogue of compelling stories that challenge their viewers with psychologically complex, often unsettling characters, but offer tremendous reward in their clever visuals, wit, and genuine human insight."

The award presentation will accompany a screening of her latest film, *Daliland* (2022), in which Ben Kingsley portrays iconoclastic painter Salvador Dali. MIFF will also present her *Charlie Says* (2018), in which a graduate student tries to deprogram three imprisoned female followers of Charles Manson; *The Moth Diaries* (2011), in which a sinister, new student who might be a vampire upsets a longtime friendship at a cloistered girls' boarding school; and social

## Maine has proclaimed July as **Lakes Appreciation Month**

Lakes was pleased to join with Maine Lakes and other lake advocates across the state in urging Maine's Governor to recognize how vital our lakes are and to support to the fullest extent possible, lake protection efforts, funding and programming. We are happy to share that Governor Mills has officially proclaimed July to be Lakes Appreciation Month in the state of Maine. (see 7lakes alliance.org) This proclamation recognizes the immense value these lakes provide us today, from recreational resources to wildlife habitat. Importantly, the proclamation highlights the recent finding from a study at the University of Maine documenting the value of Maine's lakes at over \$14.1 billion.

Lakes Appreciation Month should inspire us all to learn more about lake health and ways to get involved with lake protection efforts These include invasive aquatic plant ID workshops and plant paddles offered at 7 Lakes. Other volunteer opportunities include water quality monitoring and courtesy boat inspections. Another important action to save our lakes is through land conservation and land stewardship. By working with 7 Lakes, individuals can conserve land which is the most impactful and cost effective way to protect our lakes. Finally, the LakeSmart program helps individual land owners do their part in saving our lakes by taking simple steps, such as planting a buffer garden and maintaining septic systems. Many are surprised to learn that septic systems that were installed before 1974 can be a major source of pathogens and nutrients that feed algae in our lakes.

Our lakes are the lifeblood of our region and 7 Lakes Alliance works yearround to protect all seven lakes that comprise the Belgrade Lakes watershed. This work includes combating invasive aquatic plants, monitoring and restoring water quality, conserving land that protects the lakes, stopping algae-fueling erosion that causes green lakes, and helping people learn about lake-friendly living. We are grateful to the many generous people and partners who support our work to keep our lakes healthy.

## Memories and Tidbits from the Belgrade Historical Society

This week I would like to share the 2 attached photos of Belgrade's in 2013. Mary is the granddaughter of J.L. McCormack. ▲ Catholic Church, located on Route 27 (Main Steet) in Belgrade Lakes village and built some 111 years ago. In addition to the BHS photos, please enjoy the complete history of church's existence, as written by Mary Alter

Today as we stand on the Village Green Park we can see quite precisely that the building has changed little in it's long tenure and continues to serve the seasonal community.



Seen here is the framed building being sheathed with rough sawn boards and covered with cedar shingles. Note the stacked bundles of shingles in the work area. Keep in mind that carpenters in those days used hand saws and good old hammers.



The church is now complete and a beautiful job it is. The small white birches near the telephone pole, are right where the driveway and yard of Hello Good Pies today. The home there beside the church was built in 1948 and 49 by Albert and Lydia Johnson. Note the narrow dirt road that is Main Street or Route 27 today. The property on the right hand side of the street was part of the Belgrade Hotel's golf course and is now the Village Green Park.

### Grandkids Can Catch Them but Shouldn't Eat Them

Hard to believe this is already the 5th column of the summer! The hot weather last week, combined with the 4th of July holiday, resulted in a lot of grandkids in town for the fireworks and getting out on the lake. There was a lot of swimming, tubing, and general cooling off in and near the water. I spotted my friend, Fred Knight, out in his boat with one grandkid, while his son-in-law, Eric Carlson, out paddling nearby with his grandson, Miles. I was encouraged to see a lot of youngsters

out fishing with their families. Many of the families were catching sunfish and smallmouth bass and
keeping some for a 4th of July fish fry. I warned some of them that the youngsters shouldn't be eating fish from the lake. It's pretty depressing warning grandkids they shouldn't eat the fish they are catching!

I still remember the pride I felt when I first brought home fish the family would eat for dinner. I looked forward to sharing the bounty and learned to clean, cook, and eat fish. My Scandinavian family ate fish at least three or four times a week, especially during the summer. Fresh fish is still one of my favorite meals. Unfortunately, our grandchildren won't have that option, at least not until they are over the age of 8. Maine Inland Fish and Wildlife (IFW) and Maine Center for Disease Control (CDC) have issued safe consumption guidelines (https://www.maine.gov/ifw/fishing-boating/fishing/laws-rules/consumption-advisory.html) ) for Maine's freshwater fish, which are contaminated with mercury. Pregnant and nursing

women, women who may get pregnant, and children under age 8 are advised to eat NO freshwater fish from Maine's inland waters, except that they may safely consume one meal per month of brook trout or landlocked salmon. All others are advised to eat no more than two freshwater fish meals per month, except for brook trout and landlocked salmon, which can be safely consumed once a week. The primary source of the mercury in Maine's lakes and rivers is air pollution from coal-fired power plants in the Midwest. These plants are being phased out but WAY too slowly. Maine is particularly susceptible to mercury pollution because of our acidic precipitation and thin soils with little or no carbonates that can provide buffering. There are other site-specific restrictions for other contaminants, such as PFAS, PCBs, DIOXINS, and DDT. Recently, Maine CDC issued a consumption advisory for PFAS/PFOS for fish caught in Salmon Lake and McGrath Pond. The






general population should consume no more than one fish meal a month from these waters (children under 8 and pregnant females should consume no fish). Please check the IFW website above before consuming your fish. And please contact your federal legislators and ask

them to support stricter air pollution standards so we can eat the fish we catch!

On a brighter note, I did get out hiking a bit and had good success foraging fresh yellow chanterelle mushrooms, as well as some black trumpets beginning to appear. The wild mushrooms were turned into venison stroganoff on top of fresh pasta from the farmers' market. I also caught some nice bass on my annual "morning after" cleanup cruise the morning after the fireworks. I trolled a white zonker streamer fly behind me while I collected trash and caught 6 nice bass that were chasing schools of alewives about 15-ft down. I collected about ½ bag of assorted floating bottles and fireworks debris, but overall much cleaner than most years.

This area offers some great outdoor recreation, whether you like to hike, Continued on page 10...

## Call of the Loon

### Why so Looney?

Loon season is upon us, and as you hear the seemingly abundant wolf-like calls of the waterfowl, you'd never suspect that the species is facing steadily decreasing population productivity every year. My name is Jodie Tsih, and I am one of the Colby interns working with Loon Conservation Associates and Belgrade Lakes Association this summer. Alongside my colleague, Barlow Herbst, we've been surveying Great Pond and Long Pond for the past month to see what the loons are up to.

loons? Other than their popular appearance on the license plate of Maine vehicles, what's so special about loons? To be frank, I had little to no knowledge of loons before this summer. Besides the obvious perks of getting to be outside on the lake all summer long, monitoring loon populations didn't seem to be the most enticing ordeal, especially considering my lack of lust for avians overall. However, my passion for wildlife conservation

One may ask, why dedicate an entire summer to

trumps all, and I decided to take the plunge.

I am so grateful for this opportunity, which is only possible through the Buck
Lab at Colby, because I have now become looney for loons! (Sorry for the
corny pun!) The way the water glistens in the sun on their feathers, the

ter—it is truly a gift to watch these birds every morning. Don't get me wrong, waking up at 5 am every day is no easy feat for me, but the thrill of spotting a nesting loon wakes me up every morning.

Going into this internship, I expected it to be monotonous and somewhat boring, but boy, have I been proven wrong. Loons can be fickle

creatures, and they won't play fair with you. If they don't want to be seen, you will never see them again. There have been countless times where we've spotted a loon, and as we get closer to it in hopes of identifying the bird, it disappears underwater, leaving only fleeting air bubbles. These loons can give you a run for your money. I thought, "How hard can it be to watch loons on the lake?" and let me tell you, I can no longer count how many times I've mistaken a birch log or bark for the sneaky loon.

Although it does not seem like these beautiful birds are struggling, our surveys have indicated otherwise. Loons only lay two eggs each year, and most of the time, only one will successfully hatch. Even in scenarios where both eggs hatch, we've seen that only one chick ends up surviving after the first or second week. On Long Pond, there is only one surviving chick with no active nests, and with less than a

week left in breeding season, it is concerning that the loons don't seem too keen on blessing us with their offspring.

While the enchanting (and sometimes frustrating!) presence of loons gracing the lakes of Belgrade may seem plentiful and resilient, their declining population productivity tells a different story. My experience this summer with Loon Conservation Associates and the Belgrade Lakes Association has been nothing short of

eye-opening. The delicate balance of their existence and the challenges they face in reproducing and nurturing their young underscore the importance of continued conservation efforts. What began as a mere internship has transformed into a profound appreciation for these captivating birds and the vital work needed to ensure their survival.

Despite the early mornings and the elusive nature of loons, the privilege of observing and contributing to their conservation has been incredibly rewarding. This journey has not only deepened my passion for wildlife conservation but also instilled in me a sense of responsibility to advocate for these remarkable creatures. As the breeding season draws to a close, the sight of each surviving chick is a reminder of the fragility of life and the critical role we play in safeguarding our natural world.



On Wednesday, MIFF's Centerpiece Film will be the New England premiere of *The Ghost Trap*. According to a MIFF press release, "Gorgeously shot on Maine's stunning coastal seawaters and based on the novel by K. Stephens, the film follows a young lobsterman whose happy life is threatening to fall apart as his loving girlfriend suffers a debilitating head injury and a rival lobstering crew grows increasingly hostile."

The fourth Maine feature, *The Ruse*, will have its world premiere on Thursday at 4:00. In this suspenseful tale, a young caregiver moves into a isolated and possibly haunted coastal cottage to look after an elderly woman. Our heroine soon comes to fear for her life, as she is confronted with the mystery of her predecessor's disappearance, sinister neighbors, and supernatural occurrences. Starring legendary horror actress Veronica Cartwright (*Alien, The Birds*, and *Invasion of the Body Snatchers*), the film was shot entirely in the Maine coastal town of Blue Hill.

Besides the four Maine features, MIFF will also show three compilations of Maine shorts: Narrative, Documentary, and Music. Comprising

19 films altogether, the shorts range from 6 to 45 minutes long. Several of them deal with Central Maine: Narrative Short "The Boat Inspector" is set at a boat launch on North Pond in Smithfield; Documentary Short "The Comeback Mill" chronicles the transformation of a former paper mill in Madison into a producer of wood fiber insulation; and Music Short "Surrounded by Woods" profiles a former Floridian who opens a guitar store in Waterville. While each shorts program will be

shown twice, only the Narrative Shorts will screen before the festival's closing weekend — they will debut Wednesday at 4:00 — so we'll save further discussion of all the Maine shorts until next week.

As in the past, MIFF will offer two types of passes this year. For \$250, you can buy a Full Festival Pass, which will admit you to as many movies as you can attend., and for half that price, you can buy a 10-Pass, which is good for ten admissions, one or two people per screening. You can also buy individual tickets for \$14 each.

New this year, pass holders can reserve seats for specific screenings. You can reserve a seat on the MIFF website, by phone at 873-7000, or in person at the box office for any screening until three hours before it starts. Just be sure to show up to the screening at least 15 minutes early, or your reservation may be forfeit. Reservations are strongly encouraged, as MIFF screenings can sell out, especially those scheduled for the two smallest screening rooms, Cinema 2 (43 seats) and Cinema 3 (22 seats).

You can buy passes and tickets either online at miff.org or in person at the festival box office on the first floor of the Schupf Center. You can find the complete schedule for the festival and descriptions of the films on the MIFF website and in the the festival's glossy, 68-page program book, which is available at the Schupf Center and various other locations in Central Maine.

### The Dams Keeper Report

Well, the water temperature is finally warming up a bit more to my liking – BUT is still not quite THERE!! Upper Long Pond (at least the top 12") is a refreshing 77.4F today and in my opinion, obviously refreshing but not perfect! My toes will tell you that it is nowhere near 77.4F down there and still takes some getting used to!

As I write this week's column, Mother Nature has been unusually kind to us here in the Belgrades! The weather for our July 3rd and 4th Fireworks couldn't have been better as well as the weather for the 4th Boat and Street Parades. Boy, did we luck out and we deserve it especially considering the rain that we've had to endure earlier this season. We had just 1.79" of precipitation for the past ten days and they are forecasting a 'paltry' .85" for the next 10 days suggesting that we just may be going into another drought. Great Chamber of Commerce weather! Not that great for our farmers and gardeners!

The Village spillway dam is presently at 2.88" above full pond which is right where we want it to be with Gate 1 opened just 6" for a little flow in Mill Stream. Long Pond, at least at the Wings Mill Dam, is 3.12" also above full pond with just Gate 1 opened 12". Snow Pond is holding at 2.64" below their spillway which is still good. Salmon and McGrath are in good shape as well, although starting to feel the results of our warming temperatures, and is .36" above full pond with the 1 cfs. calibrated valve opened 15 turns.


